

#### Introduction

I joined the <a href="www.sakertour.com">www.sakertour.com</a> trip to the Danube Delta focussed on seeing the European Mink, but there had been no sightings this season on the previous two trips so we were not very hopeful. The tour was good as we saw plenty of other things.

I flew with Wizz air from Luton and stayed at an airport hotel in Bucharest.



#### Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> September

After arriving in the early hours a pickup time from my hotel of 2pm was perfect we drove to the Constanta area and had something to eat then into a night drive, a new strategy for me using thermal imagers only and only spotlighting to confirm ID and get photos. It worked well particularly for small mammals which can be overlooked when spotlighting. We found many jackals, but it was the small mammals that were of interest Steppe mouse, Common and Sibling voles and a couple of Romanian hamsters. Red fox, brown hare and badgers were also spotted, a productive night drive.





### Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> September



After a late start we headed off to some grassland areas for European souslik, here we found quite a few but most were quite skittish probably due to the large numbers of long legged and common buzzards around. Other birds of note were Isabelline wheatear, Roller, Bee-eater.

The next stop was a bat cave where it was nice and cool great to escape the midday heat, the most numerous bats were Schreiber's bent wing and a few Greater mouse eared and lesser mouse eared.

It was time for a very late lunch / early tea at a hotel, a hummingbird hawkmoth Eastern treefrog and Balkan spadefoot of note during our stay. We drove 45 mins or so to a wood with nestboxes home to Forest dormice, and the second box has a dormouse which we caught then escaped and we recaptured then escaped, we also had a spur thighed tortoise here.

We drove to Tulcea with a quick ice cream stop on the way, then took a night boat drive to Mila23 arriving at 1am A nice selection of mammals seen on the way Jackal, Racoon dog, Brown Rat, muskrat and a water shrew and a few birds.

### Friday 15<sup>th</sup> September

A late breakfast then we took the boat out for a cruise round the channels and lakes we quickly found some Great white pelicans and pygmy cormorants and a nice selection of water birds. At the edge of the village we found two grass snakes and a dice snake swimming in the channel.

We were back for a late lunch then took a walk round the island a red backed shrike, wood and green sandpipers, a massive roost of Caspian terns and a few of butterflies. We found more snakes a couple of large grass snakes and not far from the shop 4 baby grass snakes. It was time for a cold drink and a shower before tea.

We headed off for the night tour on the boat putting the thermal imager to good use locating purple heron, little bittern, osprey, kingfisher mammal wise it was less productive with mostly rats, a couple of Jackals and two harvest mice.



#### Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September

Another late breakfast before a boat trip, this time we found several Dalmatian pelicans, white tailed eagles but the highlight was a lake with a massive number of squacco herons feeding, hundreds of them quite a spectacular sight. We managed to catch up with grey headed woodpecker and red breasted flycatcher along the was as well. After lunch a few of up popped to the shop spotting grass and dice snakes on the way.

The night trip was quite cold and the mammal activity was much reduced mostly rats spotted along with a nice tawny owl.





#### Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> September

The boat trip and drive back to the airport was largely unremarkable but we did see a couple of new species for the trip Honey buzzard and Black woodpecker. The Wizz Air flight was on time the first time I have experienced this!
